

Refuse Collection

Refuse is collected every Monday. The recycling waste is collected fortnightly alternating each week with the normal waste. Food waste (to be disposed of in the small bin) is collected weekly. Local Transport

Buses. There is a new timetable for the buses serving Hunton. The No. 26 bus has a few minor changes, most noticeably that the 1407 bus from Maidstone to Hunton will now run 30 minutes earlier at 1337. The 26A bus replaces the No. 28 service, which in the morning will now start from Pattenden Lane, Marden, continue through Chainhurst, reaching the bends at the bottom of East Street at around 0730 and the stop outside the old post office on Hunton Hill at 0736. The afternoon 26A service will leave King Street, Maidstone at 1603, reaching East Street/Hunton Hill at 1622 and then continuing along East Street to Pattenden Lane for set downs only. Trains (stations) and parking. Hunton is near two stations: Paddock Wood and Marden station to London and Ashford. Paddock Wood also serves the Medway Valley Branch Line to Strood. For more details see www.southeasternrailway.co.uk . Both car parks are fee paying. If you are travelling from Marden after 0815 there is **free** parking behind the library.

There are trains from Maidstone East on the Ashford to Victoria line and you can go to Barming Station for this line.

Maidstone West is on the Medway Valley line but additionally has some high speed trains going to St Pancras.

Post Offices & Post Boxes

The village does not have a post office. You can find these in the surrounding villages of Yalding, Marden and Coxheath. They are open Monday-Friday 0800 - 1730 and 0830 - 1730 on Saturday but if it quiet they close earlier, about 1630. Yalding Post Office closes 1230 on Saturday. There are three post boxes: two located on East Street; one at the junction of East Street and Hunton Hill and the other just past Redwall Lane; and one on West Street opposite the Primary School (at the corner of Grove Lane).

Shops & Markets

The village has a 'Pop Up' shop, selling produce either grown or made by Hunton residents. The shop consists of a small stall, which is mobile and can change venue, although it tends to be held in the Village Club. The shop opens from 0900 - 1100 although if you are a producer you can bring your food/fruit/veg or plants at 0845-0900. Please let Annette Trought know what price you wish the item(s) to sell at. The shop will take 10% on goods sold. A coffee morning is also held when the Pop Up Shop is open (known as the Pop Up Cafe). Check out the village diary and the Hunton Herald and Hunton Facebook for dates when the shop is open in 2016.

In terms of small shops Coxheath probably has the largest number including a newsagents, chemist, vet, wool shop/haberdashers (inc. a dry cleaning service), butchers, library, small supermarket, bakery, hairdressers, and an off licence. There is a café and a number of takeaways: Chinese, Indian, Fish & Chips. There is a large Shell petrol station at Linton crossroads. www.coxheath.net

Marden has a butcher, two Indian restaurants (with takeaway facilities), Chinese takeaway, fish and chip/kebab shop, small supermarkets, newsagent, library, bakery, chemist, barbers, hairdressers, tool repair shop, petrol station, and a salon for beauty treatments. www.mardenpc.kentparishes.gov.uk

Yalding has a small supermarket, café, library, Indian restaurant, hairdressers and salon for beauty treatments as well as the post office. www.yaldingpc.kentparishes.gov.uk

There are several local farms that sell fresh produce including one on the left just past the Horseshoes pub in Dean Street (go up Hunton Hill and go straight on, when in season you can also pick your own from this farm). Local farmers' markets are held in East Farleigh and Yalding on a monthly basis – look out for their signs on the roadside. East Farleigh's Farmers' market is held on the 1st Sunday of the month 10 am – 1pm. There is also a large farmers market shop at Teston. The address is: Tonbridge Road, Teston, Maidstone, ME18 5BU. It is in a large barn with a big selection of fruit and vegetables, pet food, logs and kindling.

Maidstone is not far away with plenty of shops and a market at Lockmeadow on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

Paddock Wood is useful for shops, a local department store, banks etc and Tunbridge Wells also has a wide range of shops and other facilities.

Pubs/Clubs

The two closest places to drink and socialise are at the White House on 'Hilltop' on the outskirts of Hunton and the Hunton Village Club on West Street. Neither venue serves food.

The Hunton Village Club is a members' only Club but you can visit three times before deciding if you want to become a member. Annual membership, running from Jan – Dec, is £17 (£11 for those over 65). The Club has a variety of activities taking place over the course of the year with a good and varying selection of beers and ales. Local interest groups also use the Village Club as a meeting place. A little practical advice

If, like the writer of this welcome pack, you have always lived in town but wanted to enjoy life in the country here are a few things that might be useful to you:

Lighting your wood burner/fire (article taken from Country Living magazine – Jan 2012)

'Most types of wood when unseasoned, or green, are too full of sap and water to burn effectively (ash is the exception). If buying from a log merchant, check that your load will be well seasoned and ready to throw on the fire. If you are still unsure, or storing it yourself, use a moisture monitor (available at stove shops) to detect when the timber's content is below 25%. Until then, store in a pile with plenty of air circulating around it.

When your wood is ready, make a wigwam of kindling – twigs gathered from the woodland floor and dried out, or old pallets sawn into small batons – over a few scrunched up sheets of newspaper. Once the paper is lit in several places, this is the foundation of your fire. Other items to give it extra spark include fir cones, loose, dry bark and cardboard. When the kindling is roaring (if using a stove, open up the vent fully or for an open hearth, use bellows to fan the flames), start by adding one log and then more once the fire is established (in a wood burner, leave the vent partially open to keep it steady). Continue to stir and feed when necessary.

On particularly cold evenings, you may wish to stoke up the fire in a stove so its packed with logs and almost close the air vent so that it burns gently overnight and keeps your home warm till morning. Hardwoods such as oak and hornbeam are best suited to this as they are dense and slow burning'.

More suggestions and handy tips from the residents of Hunton to help you on your way

Save money by collecting kindling throughout the year. Collect up twigs and branches that have fallen down in the winds or keep the wood from trees that have been sawn down in your garden. Keep the kindling dry to ensure it is fully dried out to use in autumn and winter.

Chestnut is best for wood burners but mix oak and other hardwoods to prolong the heat in your wood burner. Over the winter save and dry your tangerine peelings – it makes good kindling.

Do have your chimney swept every year as birds love to nest on the top and soot builds up very quickly so it is easy to have a chimney fire!

Hunton is surrounded by a wonderful collection of public footpaths including a section of the Greensand Way to the North of the village.

Life doesn't have to stop once the dark nights arrive. Remember to take a torch and wear a high vis jacket when out and about after dark. Make sure you can be seen and keep safe.
