Snowdrop Sunday

12th February From 2pm to 4pm

The whole village, friends and family are invited to enjoy the abundance of beautiful snowdrops in St Mary's churchyard. Delicious refreshments will be available. We hope for winter sunshine to make for a perfect afternoon! Donations of homemade cakes would be most welcome.

Snowdrops, also known as Galanthus, are a lovely reminder that Spring is not too far away. I love to have



a small vase of snowdrops in the house to brighten the dull days. However, an old superstition led people to believe that bringing them into the house would result in impending death. These delicate flowers are sometimes known as 'Death's Flower.' This is probably because, although pretty, pure and innocent looking, the bulb is poisonous and can cause death if eaten! More positively, snowdrops are used in medical research for the benefit of human health. Galantamine is extracted from the plant and used to help treat the nervous system. It is commonly used as a treatment for Alzheimer's.

Look out for the prestigious 'Hunton Giant' and the 'Hunton Herald' snowdrops, both of which have their origins in the grounds of the former Victorian rectory. They were discovered, identified and named by David Way of Southover, Hunton and have subsequently been spread around our village. David Way, remembered by many, was a renowned expert on horticulture who studied at Cambridge University and at the RHS Gardens at Wisley. Later in life, David held a senior position at the East Malling Research Station. He, together with his second wife Anke, established the first 'Snowdrop Sunday event in the late 1990's.
