## Pastoral Letter April 2013

Easter is now behind us, and we look forward to Spring and a new Summer. For West Farleigh and the Benefice of which we are part, the months ahead are of special significance. We have a new Rector in waiting, The Reverend Peter Callway: currently a curate at Paddock Wood. It is hoped that Peter's Induction will be held at 7.30 pm on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June at Linton church.

So once more, new life and new growth lie ahead. What can we do to contribute to these changing times? Prayer is always positive and helpful; but if you are not Christian, or don't believe in Spiritual matters, then attitude can be what counts: how do we view other people? How much help can we contribute? How welcoming can we be to Peter Callway? In the coming months we should have a new car park for West Farleigh church, will that mean that we might use the church more?

There seems to be a fairly general feeling in our culture today that whatever happens, or indeed threatens, then it is someone else who should deal with it. Too often individual responsibility is not generally seen as the first point of action. Do we want our environment to be compassionate, friendly, supportive and helpful: the sort of place where we wish to live, the sort of place in which we would like our children to grow up? If the answer to these questions is "yes", then the responsibility needs to start with each one of us, and the arrival of a new Rector ought to give impetus to this philosophy.

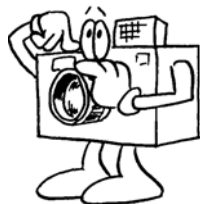
## Hunton Village Club Photographic Competition

## Out and Out

### Camellias

Camellias will just be starting to come into flower around now, their perfect waxy flowers adding a touch of exotic to the springtime theme. Essentially a woodland shrub, camellias thrive in semi-shaded positions in soil which is slightly acid. Camellias will repay a little extra care over the summer with a healthy glow and more numerous flowers.

Whether in a pot or in the ground camellias should be placed where they will get a little shade but most importantly they should not be in an east facing position where they catch the morning sun. This early warmth would burn off any frost too quickly leaving the buds and flowers brown and blotched. Over the summer, when next year's flower buds begin to form, it is important to supply the plant with enough water so they do not dry out, otherwise the plant will cast off the young buds leaving few flowers for the next year.

Finally for that healthy dark green glow camellias need lime free soil so use ericaceous compost and feed, and water them with rain water if at all possible. Also give them a good mulch with leaf mould or garden compost to keep the soil moist. If you do have alkaline soil then it would be best to grow camellias in pots, a situation where they will thrive given a little extra attention.

The food was very good and the presentation excellent. We found the prices on the food and wine menus were very reasonable. Kajol was also very helpful in regard of catering for my dietary requirements and what I should avoid.

We enjoyed four pompadours with dips followed by two starters then two main dishes and two portions of pillau rice, a bottle of sparkling water and a very good bottle of Pinot Grigio, all this was great value at under £55.00.
