### **Refuse Collection**

Refuse is collected every Monday. The recycling waste is collected fortnightly alternating each week with the normal waste. Food waste (to be disposed of in the small bin) is collected weekly. More items can be recycled such as glass and plastic food trays. A new service is also being introduced to collect textiles and small electrical items. #### Trains (stations) and parking:

Hunton is near two stations: Paddock Wood and Marden station to London and Ashford. Paddock Wood also serves the Medway Valley Branch Line to Strood. For more details see <u>www.southeasternrailway.co.uk</u>. Both car parks are fee paying. If you are travelling from Marden after 08:15 there is **free** parking behind the library.

There are trains from Maidstone East on the Ashford to Victoria line and you can go to Barming Station for this line.

Maidstone West is on the Medway Valley line but additionally has some high-speed trains going to St Pancras.

### Post Offices & Post Boxes

The village does not have a post office. You can find these in the surrounding villages of Yalding, Marden and Coxheath. They are open Monday to Friday 08:00 - 17:30 and 08:30 - 17:30 on Saturday but if it is quiet they close earlier, about 16:30. Yalding Post Office closes at 12:30 on Wednesday and Saturday. If you bank with

There are three post boxes: two located on East Street; one at the junction of East Street and Hunton Hill and the other just past Redwall Lane; and one on West Street opposite the Primary School (at the corner of Grove Lane).

### Shops & Markets

Coxheath has a good number including a newsagent, chemist, vet, wool shop/haberdashers at Clockhouse Farm, library, small supermarket, Tesco convenience store, bakery, and an off licence. There is a café and a number of takeaways: Chinese, Indian, Fish & Chips. There is a large Shell petrol station at Linton crossroads. www.coxheath.net

Marden has a butcher, two Indian restaurants (with takeaway facilities), Chinese takeaway, fish and chip/kebab shop, small supermarkets, newsagent, library, bakery, chemist, barbers, hairdressers, tool repair shop, petrol station, beauty salon, and vets. <u>www.mardenpc.kentparishes.gov.uk</u>

All supermarkets with on-line shopping facilities will deliver to Hunton.

There is a large farmers' market shop at Teston. The address is: Tonbridge Road, Teston, Maidstone, ME18 5BU. It is in a large barn with a big selection of fruit and vegetables, pet food, logs and kindling and fish on Thursdays. There is another Farm Shop at Loddington Lane, Boughton Monchelsea, along the Heath Road.

There are some Farmers' Markets in the area – best to check them out online.

Maidstone is not far away with plenty of shops and a market at Lockmeadow on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

Paddock Wood is useful for shops, a local department store, and a NatWest Bank.

Tunbridge Wells also has a wide range of shops and other facilities.
